INSIDE THE PROGRAM

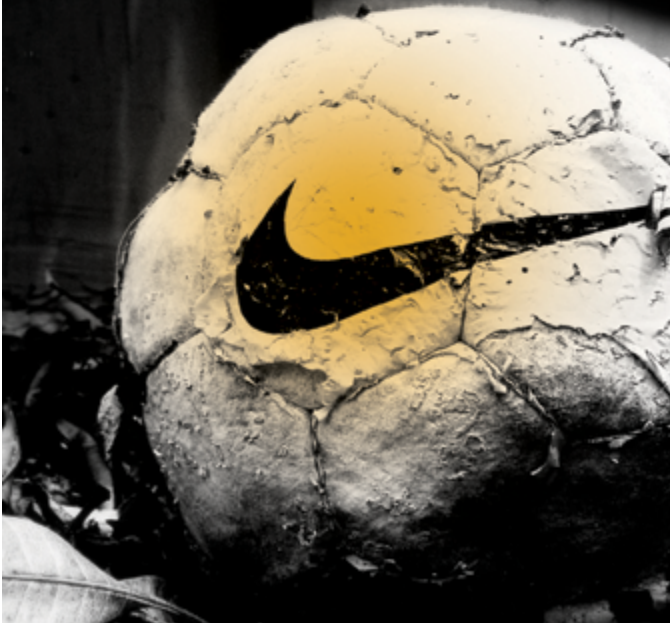
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The Black Watch Premier membership, which draws players from the Capital Region and beyond, includes numerous alumni who have achieved their goal of playing at the next level. Ten of the Club's members have participated in the US Soccer National Team Program and the National Team Training Centers. The Club has graduated over of 330 student-athletes, both boys and girls, and nearly 300 of them have gone on to play collegiately. Of those graduates, 77 of them have played or are playing at the NCAA Division I level. In addition, Black Watch Premier graduates have garnered *significant* athletic aid toward their higher education. For many graduates, their Black Watch Premier experience created college educational opportunities that their academic record would not have allowed.

At Black Watch Premier, our mission is to develop a youth soccer player strong and resilient in character, technically and tactically proficient, and physically able to meet the demands of the modern game of football through a soccer environment that is rich with technical and professional instructors and mentors, highly motivated youth players, supportive families, routine and rigorous training, and competitive contests.

Our tryouts will now be called "trials" and this "trial window" is exactly that. Trialists are welcome as a "trial member" and experience the Club's offerings through our team experience. At BWP, our teams train and compete throughout the summer in many age groups, so this trial window gives potential new members the opportunity to come into training and experience the training that is preparing the team for the upcoming competitive match.

The growth and development of these players is supported by the Club's technical staff, which is comprised of professional staff coaches, who are former professional players; National Staff members; collegiate coaches; and nationally-licensed youth coaches. The Black Watch Premier technical staff provides the necessary environment for players to be tested, pushed, assessed, trained, and re-tested over and over again in a variety of environments.

The Club is also one of only 40 clubs nationwide that are sponsored by Nike and our affiliation has provided our players with access to Nike sponsored events, the best gear and the best equipment available.

Since the club's inception in 1997, it has developed programming for youth of both genders, ages 5-23 years old. This programming is fluid and ever-changing, allowing the Club to meet the demands of the modern game of football. Through on-going professional development and daily experience in the soccer landscape, the entirety of the technical staff is constantly evaluating Club practices to best enhance the overall training as well as match environments.

GRASSROOTS

Accomplishments

Black Watch Premier has positioned itself in the Northeast Region as one of the top Clubs in the Region and as well as in the entire United States. Black Watch Premier was recognized as one of the Top 11 Clubs in the entire US by SYL and Directors of each of the 125 competing Clubs around the US. (USL Top 11 in 2012)

Club Highlights:

- 2006-07 – 1 team to SYL Nationals, 1 ENYSSA State Cup semi-finalist, 11 graduating players went on to play in college.
- 2007-08 – 2 teams to SYL Nationals, 1 ENYSSA State Cup finalist and three quarterfinalists, 22 out of 24 graduating players went on to play in college.
- 2008-09 – Three teams to the SYL Nationals, 1 ENYSSA State Cup finalist-champion, 4 semifinalists and 2 quarterfinalists, all 23 graduating players went on to play in college. First player in Club history to be drafted in Major League Soccer: Paul Gerstenberger - Columbus Crew.
- 2009-10 – 2 teams to SYL Nationals, 1 ENYSSA State Cup finalist, 22 out of 24 graduating players went on to play in college.
- 2010-11 -- 2 teams to SYL Nationals, 1 ENYSSA State Cup champion and 3 quarterfinalists, 23 out of 26 graduating players went on to play in college.
- 2011-12 – 2 teams to SYL Nationals, 1 ENYSSA State Cup finalist, 5 of 6 teams placed 1st in Jefferson Cup, 1 Potomac Cup champion, 18 out of 20 graduating players went on to play in college.
- 2012-2014 - Boys U13 won Potomac Cup and Boys U15 won both the Manhattan and Jefferson Cup. Boys U16 were finalist in the San Diego Surf Cup (one of the largest tournaments in the country). 50 out of the 60 Club graduating players went on to play in college.
- 2015-2016 - Boys U15 made Potomac Cup finals. Boys U12 and Girls u13/14s won Manhattan Cup. U12 Boys won Ramapo Valley Indoor Tournament, U18 Boys won Bethesda Tournament and U17 Boys won the Massapequa Tournament
- The Club has become a core club in EDP. EDP is one of the most competitive leagues in the US.

Our Regional Flight (Boys 2003 and 2004)

BWP REGIONAL FLIGHT - BOYS 2003 and 2004

The Regional Flight is a bridge from the development flight to the more advanced National flight. The programming places increased technical, physical and tactical demands on the players, through competitive state and regional match play. Training is two to three times per week and also features Futsal as part of its programming. The training-to-match ratio is 2.5:1. The flight participates in league play in the EDP and various USYS state and regional leagues plus Super Y league, for a total of six to eight regional tournaments throughout the 9-month season.

Our National Flight is designed for players who wish to play at the next level, which is, in most cases, college soccer. To best prepare our players to reach their goals, this flight has a training-to-match ratio of 3:1, which we modeled on what the US Soccer Academy demands and expects of its member clubs. Training for this flight is three times per week over the course of a 9-month season.

This program is enhanced by the BWP Leadership Academy, classroom sessions, competitive league fixtures in EDP and the various USYS Regional Leagues, Futsal to increase speed of play and improve technique, and direct access to collegiate coaches who serve on the BWP technical staff. The flight participates in six to eight regional and national-level tournaments throughout the 9-month season.
